

A regular meeting of the City Council was held at City Hall, 200 S. Main Street on Monday, April 9, 2018. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Malewski called the meeting to order.

Present were Mayor Malewski and Councilpersons Burke, Harri, Wichman and Colestock. None were absent.

The invocation was given by Pastor Mark Michaelwicz of the Island City Baptist church.

Councilman Harri moved the Agenda be approved as printed, but with Item 10c., under New Business being removed; seconded by Councilwoman Colestock, passed unanimously.

Councilwoman Colestock moved the March 26, 2018, Regular Minutes be approved as printed; seconded by Councilman Harri, passed unanimously.

Councilwoman Colestock moved that disbursements in the amount of \$906,482.48, be approved; seconded by Councilman Burke, passed unanimously.

Councilman Wichman moved Council approve the sale of the timber at Oak Ridge Park to the high bidder of Quality Hardwoods of Sunfield, Michigan, in the Amount of \$10,401.00, and the proceeds of the Sale being designated for future improvements to Oak Ridge Park; seconded by Councilman Burke, passed unanimously.

Councilman Harri moved Council approve to designate City Manager Aaron Desentz as the Michigan Department of Transportation Street Administrator for the City; seconded by Councilwoman Colestock, passed unanimously.

Councilman Wichman reported on the following: formally welcomed City Manager Desentz to the City; and is very excited about the Rising Tide designation as well as the Michigan Main Street and Redevelopment Ready Programs that are already underway for the City to keep moving forward in a positive way; and that winter is officially over as the DPW is removing the salters from the trucks.

City Manager Desentz reported on the following: that they have held all of the interviews for the Quality of Life Director position and that an offer has been made to one of the candidates pending background checks and acceptance.

Mayor Malewski reported on the following: that he is excited about the Rising Tide, Michigan Main Street and Redevelopment Ready programs that the City is participating in; that Governor Snyder had visited the City last week, and that this had been an invitation only meeting per the Governor's Office and the meeting was very well received; welcomed the City Clerk back from vacation; and that winter is officially over now that the salters are being removed from the trucks.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:16 p.m.
