

A regular meeting of the City Council was held at City Hall, 200 S. Main Street on Tuesday, May 29, 2018. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Malewski called the meeting to order.

Present were Mayor Malewski and Councilpersons Harri, Wichman, Burke and Colestock. None were absent.

The invocation was given by Pastor Lance of the Eaton Rapids Thrive church.

Councilman Harri moved the Agenda be approved as printed; seconded by Councilwoman Colestock, passed unanimously.

Councilwoman Colestock moved the May 14, 2018, Regular Minutes and the May 21, 2018 Worksession Minutes be approved as printed; seconded by Councilman Burke, passed unanimously.

Councilman Wichman moved that disbursements in the amount of \$275,563.69, be approved; seconded by Councilwoman Colestock, passed unanimously.

Councilman Burke moved Council approve the Mayor's recommendation to appoint Rick Acker, 302 Kerry Street, to the Local Development Finance Authority Board for an unexpired term which will expire on May 23, 2020; seconded by Councilman Wichman, passed unanimously.

Mayor Malewski read Council's Resolutions honoring the Eaton Rapids High School senior graduating class of 2018 top ten students and presented the Resolutions to the Top Ten in attendance at the meeting. All honorees received applause.

Rod Schultz, 1303 Montgomery Street, appeared before Council regarding the bridge repair; cemetery; dead tree in the 1300 block of West Street; thanked the City for fixing the fountain at Memorial Park; and a Police Department issue.

Councilman Burke reported on the following: congratulated the 2018 graduates and the Top 10 students for all of their hard work and dedication.

Councilman Wichman reported on the following: congratulated the Top 10 and wished them well in their future endeavors.

Councilman Harri reported on the following: thanked City Staff for the wonderful job that they did in making the City and Cemetery ready for Memorial Day; and congratulated the graduates who had represented their City and School with distinction.

Councilwoman Colestock reported on the following: congratulated the Top 10 on their accomplishments and all of the Class of 2018; thanked City Staff for all of their hard work in getting the City ready for Memorial Day; and thanked the AmVets and G.A.R. for hosting the Memorial Day parade.

Fire Chief McNutt reported on the following: that they are still working closely with the Mag Plant and if Council had any questions to see him.

Mayor Malewski reported on the following: congratulated the Top Ten and is immensely proud of them and urged them to never forget where they came from; that Staff did a great job on the City clean-up for Memorial Day; that he had the opportunity to walk the Parade route and it was a great experience; that the LAFCU food drive will be happening from June 1st through June 30th with all of the proceeds being donated to Heart and Hands and that all of the items donated will be transported to Heart and Hands by Two Men And A Truck free of charge; and that there is a big bike rally being planned during the Urban Air Event.
