

A regular meeting of the City Council was held at City Hall, 200 S. Main Street on Monday, June 11, 2018. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Malewski called the meeting to order.

Present were Mayor Malewski and Councilpersons Harri, Wichman, Burke and Colestock. None were absent.

The invocation was given by Pastor Riley of the Eaton Rapids Assembly of God church.

Councilman Harri moved the Agenda be approved as printed; seconded by Councilwoman Colestock, passed unanimously.

Councilman Harri moved the May 29, 2018, Regular Minutes and the June 4, 2018 Worksession Minutes be approved as printed; seconded by Councilman Wichman, passed unanimously.

Councilman Wichman moved that disbursements in the amount of \$211,737.96, be approved; seconded by Councilwoman Colestock. Councilman Burke asked that the invoice from the Assessor be reviewed and further information given to Council regarding this invoice. The motion passed unanimously.

Councilman Harri moved Council open the Public Hearing on the Proposed 2018/2019 Budget and the Proposed Millage Rate to be levied to support the Proposed 2018/2019 Budget; seconded by Councilwoman Colestock, passed unanimously. The Public Hearing Opened at 7:05 p.m.

There were no questions or comments from the Public.

Councilman Harri moved Council close the Public Hearing on the Proposed 2018/2019 Budget and the Proposed Millage Rate to be levied to support the Proposed 2018/2019 Budget; seconded by Councilwoman Colestock, passed unanimously. The Public Hearing Closed at 7:06 p.m.

Councilwoman Colestock moved Council approve the Resolution of Interest to Establish a District Library; seconded by Councilman Burke, passed unanimously.

Councilman Wichman moved Council approve the Mayor's recommendation to appoint Jan Denton, 423 Dexter Street, to the District Library Planning Committee; seconded by Councilwoman Colestock, passed unanimously.

Councilwoman Colestock moved Council approve the Mayor's recommendation to appoint Kathleen Ostrowski, 429 Canal Street, to the District Library Planning Committee; seconded by Councilwoman Colestock, passed unanimously.

City Clerk Reinecke Read for First Reading Ordinance 2018-2, an Ordinance to Amend Section 14-35 of Article II of Chapter 14, Motor Vehicles and Traffic, of the Codified Ordinances of the City of Eaton Rapids, Eaton County, Michigan, to Prohibit the Overnight Parking of Both Motor Vehicles and Various Trailers. This was for First Reading Only, no Council action was required.

Councilwoman Colestock moved Council approve the July 4<sup>th</sup> Parade and planned activities; seconded by Councilman Harri, passed unanimously.

Rod Schultz, 1303 Montgomery Street, appeared before Council regarding noxious weeds; speeding cars; bridge graffiti; water fountain; Cemetery hedges; junk cars; Industrial Park mowing; utility rates; and the City appraisal.

Melissa Riley, Second Grade Teacher, appeared before Council regarding the Rainbow Splash Pad not happening in Eaton Rapids and would be refunding donations.

Barb Rogers, Eaton County Commissioner, appeared before Council and stated that her donation could be given to the City and used for a project; and gave an update on the County's Budget and the issue of solar fields.

Councilman Harri reported on the following: thanked the Staff and the Budget Committee for all of their work and time; and that it is great to see the City and Townships working together towards the formation of a District Library.

Councilman Wichman reported on the following: that the City Manager has reported that Mag Products is moving forward and the process is going well and there is lots happening and that there is now a stronger relationship with Mag Products; and that the Eaton Rapids Softball team has won Regionals and will be playing in the State Quarter Finals tomorrow and wished them luck; and that he will be attending a Redevelopment Ready Workshop on Thursday.

Councilwoman Colestock reported on the following: thanked everyone for attending; congratulated the Eaton Rapids Softball team on their accomplishments; that there was a meeting earlier tonight on the Rising Tide Program and urged all to attend as they were interesting; and thanked Mrs. Riley and her class for all of their hard work.

Mayor Malewski reported on the following: congratulated the Eaton Rapids Softball team and the coaches; and thanked Mrs. Riley and her class who worked diligently on this project.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:35 p.m.
