

A regular meeting of the City Council was held at City Hall, 200 S. Main Street on Monday, September 26, 2011, at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Platte called the meeting to order.

Present were Mayor Platte and Councilpersons Brown, Greenhoe, Letarte and Harri. None were absent.

The invocation was given by Pastor Jim Riley of the Assembly of God Church.

Councilwoman Brown moved Council approve the Agenda as printed; seconded by Councilman Greenhoe, passed unanimously.

The September 12, 2011 Regular Minutes and the September 19, 2011, Worksession Minutes were approved as printed.

Councilwoman Brown moved that disbursements of \$185,460.43, with the breakdown being General Fund Checks in the amount of \$115,074.56 - check numbers 57915 through 57968, and Wire Transfers in the amount of \$70,385.87; seconded by Councilman Harri, passed unanimously.

Mayor Platte opened the meeting for a Public Hearing on the Updated 2012 through 2015 Energy Optimization Plan. The Public Hearing opened at 7:07 p.m.

DPW Director Poyer explained the 2012-2015 Energy Optimization Plan. There were no questions from Council or the public.

Mayor Platte closed the Public Hearing on the Updated 2012 through 2015 Energy Optimization Plan at 7:09 p.m.

Councilman Harri moved that the Agreement for Environmental Services between the City of Eaton Rapids and Parsons Brinckerhoff Michigan, Inc., Modification #1, for the City of Eaton Rapids Landfill, and authorize City manager Stoppels to sign said Agreement be approved; seconded by Councilman Greenhoe, passed unanimously.

Harold Hovey, 103 Erin Court, appeared before Council regarding City Code 14.43, Parking in Yards.

Rod Schultz, 1303 Montgomery Street, appeared before Council thanking Councilman Letarte for his service to the City; Parking in yards and enforcement in commercial areas; and the landfill methane gas issue.

Mayor Platte reported on the following: reminded everyone that the Homecoming Parade is Friday; and thanked the City Clerk for correcting the website issue.

Councilman Harri reported on the following: thanked the City Clerk for her work at running the High School Elections; and that the methane gas at the landfill was not equitable to harness as it was a volume issue.

Police Chief Malewski reported on the following: that Safety Town was last week and there were over 240 kids that went through the program and it has been in service for over 24 years.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:23 p.m.
