

A regular meeting of the City Council was held at City Hall, 200 S. Main Street on Monday, April 8, 2013. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Platte called the meeting to order.

Present were Mayor Platte and Councilpersons Greenhoe, Harri and Norris. Councilwoman Brown was absent and excused.

The invocation was given by Pastor Jim Riley of the Assembly of God Church.

The Agenda was approved as printed.

The March 25, 2013, Regular Minutes were approved as printed.

Councilman Greenhoe moved that disbursements of \$247,756.73 be approved, with the breakdown being General Fund Checks in the amount of \$55,508.17 - check numbers 60419 through 60466 and Wire Transfers in the amount of \$192,248.56; seconded by Councilman Harri, passed unanimously.

Todd Nichols, the WWTP/DPW Director, introduced to Council John Nobach, who is the new hire at the DPW, and has started working for the City as of April 1st. Council congratulated Mr. Nobach on his position and stated that they looked forward to a long working relationship with Mr. Nobach and was glad that he was a part of the City team. Mr. Nobach received applause.

Councilman Norris moved Council approve the Mayor's recommendation to reappoint Mike McGhan, 613 Forest Street, to the Advisory Parks Board for a Three Year Term which will expire on March 31, 2016; seconded by Councilman Greenhoe, passed unanimously.

Councilman Harri moved Council approve the Agreement with the Clean Energy Coalition for the Area Wide Master Plan for the Council of Governments in an amount not to exceed \$4,946.00; seconded by Councilman Norris, passed unanimously.

Barb Lietzke, 1303 Hall Street, appeared before Council regarding the snow and ice on the sidewalks; road work in the City; and Burger King.

Rod Schultz, 1303 Montgomery Street, appeared before Council regarding the front door at City Hall; and the Police Department.

Randall Syme, 704 Hyatt Street, appeared before Council regarding his two utility accounts in the City.

Councilman Harri reported on the following: welcomed John Nobach to the City team and looked forward to many years of service to the City and congratulated him on being hired.

City Manager Stoppels reported on the following: that the budget work is going well; that the concession stand facility improvements are nearly completed; that grounds

maintenance program is working well with the new signs at the DPW; that the efforts at the Cemetery are being received extremely well and that this is a high priority area and Keith Miller is doing a great job.

DPW/WWTP Director Nichols reported on the following: that he has been meeting with the Schools on possibly using them for fleet service work and will be reporting back to Council at a future Worksession.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:25 p.m.
