

A regular meeting of the City Council was held at City Hall, 200 S. Main Street on Monday, August 12, 2013. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Platte called the meeting to order.

Present were Mayor Platte and Councilpersons Greenhoe, Brown, Harri and Burke. None were absent.

The invocation was given by Councilwoman Claudia Brown.

The Agenda was approved as printed.

The July 22, 2013, Regular Minutes and the August 5, 2013, Worksession Minutes were approved as printed.

Councilwoman Brown moved that disbursements of \$418,387.37 be approved, with the breakdown being Meter Deposit Refund Checks in the amount of \$1,169.50 - check numbers 100887 through 100900; General Fund Checks in the amount of \$130,573.31 - check numbers 60863 through 60961 and Wire Transfers in the amount of \$286,644.56; seconded by Councilman Harri, passed unanimously.

Councilwoman Brown moved Council approve Traffic Control Order 99, to have the No Parking Signs on the east side of the 400 block of Hall Street between King Street and W. Broad Street removed and that parking be permitted; seconded by Councilman Harri, passed unanimously.

Councilman Greenhoe moved Council approve the Mayor's recommendation to appoint Kristy Reinecke, City Clerk, to be the Officer Delegate at the 2013 MERS Annual Conference; seconded by Councilman Harri, passed unanimously.

Councilwoman Brown moved Council approve the election conducted by City Staff to have Patrick Reinecke be the Employee Delegate and Dan Chamberlain be the Employee Alternate at the 2013 MERS Annual Conference; seconded by Councilman Burke, passed unanimously.

Councilman Harri reported on the following: that he had been the DJ at the Eaton Rapids Township Fire Department car show this weekend and there were 51 cars and it was a great event to help raise money for the Township Fire Department.

Councilwoman Brown reported on the following: that the Eaton Rapids Assembly of God church, of whom Councilman Burke was a member, had given away free groceries to citizens in the Eaton Rapids area this weekend and had served over 600 families and what a great event this was and an outreach to the City.

WWTP/DPW Director Nichols reported on the following: that he had gone to Jack Doheny company to their warehouse sale and had purchased a sewer camera at considerable savings to the City.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:32 p.m.
