

A regular meeting of the City Council was held at City Hall, 200 S. Main Street on Monday, July 14, 2014. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Platte called the meeting to order.

Present were Mayor Platte and Councilpersons Brown, McGee, Harri and Burke. None were absent.

The invocation was given by Pastor Mark Michalcewicz of the Grace Baptist Church.

The Agenda was approved as printed.

The June 23, 2014, Regular Minutes were approved as printed.

Councilman McGee moved that disbursements of \$402,539.42 be approved, with the breakdown being General Fund Checks in the amount of \$173,716.24 - check numbers 62357 through 62408; Meter Deposit Refund Checks in the amount of \$1,971.23 - check numbers 101017 through 101032 and Wire Transfers in the amount of \$226,851.95; seconded by Councilwoman Brown, passed unanimously.

Councilwoman Brown moved Council approve the proposal from CBI for the server upgrade in an amount not to exceed \$37,184.09; seconded by Councilman Burke, passed unanimously.

Rod Schultz, 1303 Montgomery Street, appeared before Council regarding Councilman McGee on Food Court Wars win; Mike Simpson Drive; Main and State Street trash barrel; water fountain at Memorial Park; and the fireplace.

Councilman Harri reported on the following: that he will be out of town on vacation so will miss the next meeting; that the park is looking great and getting ready for the Playground build and this is very exciting.

Councilman McGee reported on the following: that the 4th of July was amazing and was a great time.

City Manager Stoppels reported on the following: that the 4th of July was a success and was a family oriented event and that a lot of positive comments have been made about holding the fireworks at Howe Field and hopes that the July 4th Committee will take this under consideration; that the Playground is ready to go; and that the Dog Park is on hold until after the Playground build.

Police Chief Weeks reported on the following: that the Department had assisted Delta Township on July 3rd with their fireworks display; and that the County had assisted the City with our 4th of July fireworks display.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:26 p.m.
