

A worksession of the City Council was held at City Hall, 200 S. Main Street, on Monday, April 20, 2015, at 5:00 p.m.

New Business Topics of Discussion were:

Utility Director Poyer reviewed with the Council the proposal from IDC Corporation for the Water System Update on the remote monitoring system. This item will appear on the April 27th Agenda.

City Clerk Reinecke reviewed with the Council the request from the Troy D. Nealey AMVETS Post 1582 to host the 2015 Memorial Day Parade on Monday, May 25th beginning at 11:00 a.m. This item will appear on the April 27th Agenda.

Utility Director Poyer reviewed with the Council the funding availability through the Michigan Energy Office, Clean Energy Coalition for electric vehicle charging stations. Utility Director Poyer stated that this would be a cost to the City of approximately \$15,000 for one charging station. After Council review it was the desire of Council to revisit this at a later date.

Utility Director Poyer reviewed with the Council the proposal from Peerless Midwest, Inc., for the Wellhead Protection Plan Update. Utility Director Poyer stated that this project was not budgeted for, but he still had available monies in the Water Budget. This item will appear on the April 27th Agenda.

City Manager Stoppels reviewed the Safe Routes to School Project and the suggested changes/additions to the project. Council thanked City Manager Stoppels for the idea and update.
