

A regular meeting of the City Council was held at City Hall, 200 S. Main Street on Monday, August 10, 2015. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Pro Tem Harri called the meeting to order.

Present were Mayor Pro Tem Harri and Councilpersons McGee, Burke and Brown. Mayor Platte was absent and excused.

The invocation was given by Pastor Jim Riley of the Assembly of God Church.

The Agenda was approved as printed.

The July 27, 2015, Regular Minutes and the August 3, 2015, Worksession Minutes were approved as printed.

Councilwoman Brown moved that disbursements of \$342,831.00 be approved with the breakdown being General Fund Checks in the amount of \$136,258.82 - check numbers 64135 through 64203; Meter Deposit Refund Checks in the amount of \$1,008.96 - check numbers 101189 through 101197; and Wire Fund Transfers in the amount of \$205,563.22; seconded by Councilman McGee, passed unanimously.

There were no Public Comments.

Councilman Burke moved Council approve the Special Event Request from GAR Museum for the Civil War Day of Discovery Event to be held on Wednesday, August 19th from 10:00 a.m. until 3:00 p.m., with events on GAR Island Park as outlined by the Grand Army of the Republic Memorial Hall and Museum; seconded by Councilwoman Brown, passed unanimously.

Councilman Burke moved Council approve the Special Event Request from Eaton Rapids High School for the Homecoming Parade to be held on Friday, October 9th, with the parade route being S. River to State and ending on Greyhound Drive, with the line-up beginning at 5:00 p.m., and the Parade beginning at 6:00 p.m.; seconded by Councilman McGee, passed unanimously.

Councilwoman Brown moved Council approve the Resolution regarding the Freedom of Information Act; seconded by Councilman McGee, passed unanimously.

Councilwoman Brown reported on the following: that she has heard that citizens are very impressed with the DPW and Staff out on the street; and thanked all of the staff for everything that they do to make the City look so wonderful.

Councilman McGee reported on the following: that citizens feel that they are not heard when they come to Council Meetings, but at the previous Council Meeting a citizen had a concern with the Hall Street Bridge and that it has already been repaired, so urged citizens to come to them with their concerns and they will be addressed.

Councilman Burke reported on the following: that Advanced Auto is open and that the new building looks great and is a great addition to the City.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:12 p.m.
