

A worksession of the City Council was held at City Hall, 200 S. Main Street, on Monday, August 1, 2016, at 5:00 p.m.

Present were Mayor Pro Tem Harri and Councilpersons McGee, Colestock and Burke. Mayor Platte was absent and excused.

Administrative Staff Present was City Manager Jon Stoppels, Police Chief Larry Weeks, Building Official LeRoy Hummel, Fire Chief Roger McNutt, City Treasurer Marrie Jo Carr, Quality of Life Director Troy Stowell, Library Director Anna Curtis, and City Clerk Kristy Reinecke.

Department Head Reports:

Fire Chief McNutt reported on the following: that a Katherine Dennis will be out collecting donations for the Police and Fire Departments to purchase children's books for them to give out.

Councilman Burke asked about the recycling grant. City Treasurer Carr stated that it was the S.W.A.G. Grant through Eaton County and it was for \$16,000.00.

Councilwoman Colestock asked about the Dog Park. Quality of Life Director Stowell stated that work was being done and a grand opening would be scheduled. Councilwoman Colestock also asked about people who are interested in being on the Quality of Life Board. Quality of Life Director Stowell stated that he was working on an application that he would be presenting to the Quality of Life Board before citizens could come into City Hall and apply for the openings.

New Business Topics of Discussion were:

Quality of Life Director Stowell reviewed with Council the Special Event Request from the GAR to hold a Day Camp event on Island Park on August 17th. This item will appear on the August 8th Agenda for Council consideration.

Police Chief Weeks reviewed with Council the two traffic Control Orders that he was proposing that Council approve. Police Chief Weeks stated that one was for a Blind Child and that the other was to move yield signs from Connemara at Erin Court and Tara Court be redirected to Erin Court and Tara Court. City Clerk Reinecke stated that the Control Orders would go to the DPW for the work to be completed and then Council has 90 days to act on the two Orders so that they would become permanent. This item will appear on the September 26th Agenda for Council consideration.
