

A regular meeting of the City Council was held at City Hall, 200 S. Main Street on Monday, October 10, 2016. The meeting was called to order at 7:00 p.m.

Mayor Platte called the meeting to order.

Present were Mayor Platte and Councilpersons Harri, Burke, McGee and Colestock. None were absent.

The invocation was given by Pastor Mark Michalcewicz of the Island City Baptist church.

The Agenda was approved as printed.

The September 26, 2016, Regular Minutes and the October 3, 2016 Worksession Minutes were approved as printed.

Councilman Harri moved that disbursements of \$423,339.80 be approved with the breakdown being General Fund Checks in the amount of \$254,392.05 - check numbers 66205 through 66270; and Wire Fund Transfers in the amount of \$168,947.75; seconded by Councilman McGee, passed unanimously.

Councilman McGee moved Council approve the Eaton Rapids Area Chamber of Commerce request to hold their annual Hometown Family Christmas event and parade on Saturday, December 3, 2016, with the parade route being from McArthur River Drive to State Street, north on Main Street and ending on Knight Street, with the parade beginning at 6:00 p.m.; seconded by Councilwoman Colestock, passed unanimously.

Councilwoman Colestock moved Council approve the Resolution in support of the Michigan Main Street program; seconded by Councilman McGee, passed unanimously.

Abby Lynch, from the Barry/Eaton Health Department, appeared before Council and gave an update on what is happening and offerings at the Health Department. Council thanked Ms. Lynch for the update.

Councilman McGee reported on the following: that the Urban Air Event was a really great event and a good time was had by all; and that Fall is in the air so get out and take advantage of the weather and take a walk around the beautiful City.

City Manager Stoppels reported on the following: gave Council a brief update on the status of the parking lot construction work that is to be completed yet this year.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:10 p.m.
