

A regular meeting of the City Council was held at City Hall, 200 S. Main Street on Monday, September 25, 2017. The meeting was called to order at 6:00 p.m.

Mayor Platte called the meeting to order.

Present were Mayor Platte and Councilpersons Harri, Burke, McGee and Colestock. None were absent.

The invocation was given by Pastor Jim Riley of the Assembly of God Church.

The Agenda was approved as printed.

The September 11, 2017, Regular Minutes and the September 18, 2017 Special Meeting Minutes were approved as printed.

Councilman Burke moved that disbursements in the amount of \$495,439.25, be approved; seconded by Councilman Harri, passed unanimously.

Councilwoman Colestock moved that Council approve the Halloween Trick-or-Treat hours to be held on Tuesday, October 31<sup>st</sup> from 6:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., with the emergency siren signaling the beginning and ending; and also to allow the closure of Knight Street at the Catholic Church parking lot, with the East entrance barricaded; the closure of Union Street at Union Street School parking lot; barricades to be placed on Miller Drive at Hastay Boulevard to prohibit traffic in this area during the Event; seconded by Councilman McGee, passed unanimously.

Councilwoman Colestock moved Council approve the Main Street Trick-or-Treat Event to be held on Wednesday, October 25<sup>th</sup> from 5:00 p.m. to 7:00 p.m. and the rain date to be Thursday, October 26<sup>th</sup>, with crossing guards located at Hamlin; seconded by Councilman McGee, passed unanimously.

Rod Schultz, 1303 Montgomery Street, appeared before Council regarding parks, cemetery, junk cars, ordinance violations, weeds and mowing, street lights, and the fountain at Memorial Park.

Russ Hicks, 7900 Columbia Hwy., appeared before Council and gave an update on the Grand River Water Trail and river update.

Councilman Burke reported on the following: that he has happy to see the Main Street Trick-or-Treat Event continue as this was a great event for kids and families.

Police Chief Weeks reported on the following: that he is working with the Juvenile Mental Health Board on a "Handle With Care" program.

The meeting was adjourned at 6:25 p.m.
